B. Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes

1. Course Description This course offers vocabulary explanations and practice for upper-intermediate level (B2) learners of English. It expands students' vocabulary with explanations and practice exercises.
2. Course Main Objective The course aims to deepen and expand students' knowledge of English vocabulary by 1)

enlarging their productive and receptive vocabulary stores in a thematic framework; 2) providing insights into the mechanisms of vocabulary learning and acquisition as well as English dictionary use; and 3) familiarizing them with the rules of word formation. Through exercises participants will be introduced to the upper-intermediate level vocabulary of a variety of topics, whereby they will also gain a more profound understanding of the aspects of word knowledge, i.e. form (homonyms), meaning (confusing word pairs, connotations, etc.) and use (collocations, word grammar, etc.).
